



ISLA CANELA TOURS TOURNAMENT ISLA CANELA GOLF LOCAL RULES

OUT OF BOUNDS - (Rule 27):

Defined by :

- White stakes and white lines
- Metallic fences.

When out of bounds is defined by reference to stakes, fences or walls, the out of bounds is determined by the nearest inside point at ground level.

OBSTRUCTIONS - (Rule 24):

MOVABLE - (Rule 24/1):

- Stones and shells in Bunkers are considered movable obstructions

IMMOVABLE - (Rule 24/2):

- Any concrete, asphalted or sand path through the green.
- Red and Blue stakes defining distances to the green.
- Hole 18: The scenic area located on the left, right and behind the green. The player will have to use the dropping area.
- If a ball lies on bare earth beneath a tree on fairway, rule 24/2 applies.

SPECIAL OBSTRUCTIONS:

- The green and white stakes in front of the greens are considered movable obstructions and Rule 24/1 will apply. If a ball strikes a stake, the stroke ball may be cancelled and replayed without penalty. If the ball is not immediately recoverable another ball may be substituted.
- If a ball hits the obelisk on hole 13 the ball maybe replayed without penalty.

ABNORMAL GROUND CONDITION - (Rule 25):

- Any area marked with blue stakes or closed with white line are considered as ground under repair.
- Drainage Ditches covered with stones are considered as Ground under repair.
- Winter rules are in effect from October 15th till April 15th. A ball lying on a closely mown area through the green may, without a penalty, be moved or may be lifted, cleaned and placed within 15 cm (2/3 of an Isla Canela score card) of where it originally laid, but not nearer to the hole and not in hazard or on the putting green.
- Hole 18: If the ball lies in the drainage ditches to the left or right behind the 18th green, the player can drop the ball in the dropping zone.

DROPPING ZONE:

- Hole 10: Men that play from yellow can drop the ball in the area left of the red tee, If the ball is lost after the first stroke.

NOTE:

- The service path located on the right side on holes number, 7, 10, and 11 are part of the lateral hazard. Fairway bunker on the right side of the hole 9 is now defined as "waste area" and the player can ground the club without penalty.

PENALTY FOR BREAK OF THESE LOCAL RULES:

Stroke Play : 2 strokes
Match Play: Loss of hole
